- 1. The disciples have experienced Jesus feeding 5,000-plus people with five loaves of bread and two fish. They have experienced Jesus feeding 4,000-plus people with seven loaves and a few fish.

 - b. Why do we worry when our own resources or the resources of the church or other helping organizations run lower than we'd like—when our cupboards or food pantries have not much more than one loaf of bread?
- 2. Jesus says, "Why are you talking about having no bread? Do you still not perceive or understand?"
 - a. Why does Jesus become distressed with the disciples when they are discussing the one loaf of bread?
